- **Use it.** Demand supports the justification for funding. If you have school-age children with access to the school bus, why not send them to school on the safest ride in town?
- Educate the community. Spread the word about the many benefits of school bus ridership. Schoolbusfacts.com can provide you with resources to help.
- Advocate for funding. Communicate with locally elected officials in your area to let them know that access to school bus transportation is important to you.
